As a group of highly specialized individuals, the graduands are ready to join the rest of the Kenyan citizens in realising the country's development agenda. I note that Laikipia University's strategic location along the Lamu Port, South Sudan Ethiopia Transport (LAPSSET) corridor, is in the midstream between the Southern and the Northern parts of Kenya, which presents tremendous opportunities for growth. The University's strategic location at a high altitude perfectly matches its niche of becoming a centre of excellence in Sports Science and Sustainable Utilization of Arid and Semi-Arid resources. Equally, through strategic partnerships, specialized sports programmes, and leveraging its natural advantages, Laikipia University can play a pivotal role in shaping the future of athletics and sports science in the country. With this programme, the University exemplifies its commitment to Competency-Based Education (CBE) and is providing an important pathway to students. I urge you to invest in facilities, research, athlete development, and community outreach, in order to position the university as a centre of excellence for sports training, education, and innovation, both within Kenya and internationally.

In line with the government's broader education reform agenda that places emphasis on the delivery of quality, relevant, and sustainable education, my Ministry has directed universities to progressively prepare for the successful implementation of Competency-Based Education, ensuring that they are ready to provide the practical, industry-relevant skills that graduates need. This is essential if we are to meet the needs of Kenya's growing economy and our ambitions for Vision 2030.

A key reform focus is the **Competency-Based Education (CBE)** model, which is fundamental to the ongoing transformation of our education system. I note with pleasure that Laikipia University has aligned its curricula with the CBE principles to ensure that graduates have the competencies and skills required by employers and society at large. What remains is establishing training facilities, securing resources, and

continuous fostering of global partnerships that will ensure our educational quality is at par with the best in the world.

The Competency-Based Curriculum is important in that it focuses on what learners are expected to **do** at the end of their training learning programme, rather than on what they are expected to **know**. CBC is based on the idea that learning is more than just acquiring knowledge; it is also about developing skills and abilities that can be applied in real-world situations.

Globally, universities are recognized for their research output, which is driven by postgraduate programmes. I am pleased that Laikipia University boasts of a robust Graduate School that responds to the country's needs for skilled professionals. It is also commendable to note that postgraduate students in Laikipia University are able to complete their studies in record time. This is the kind of efficiency we need to see from other universities as well.

In line with Kenya's Vision 2030, Bottom-Up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA) and our national development goals, the Government remains committed to supporting our universities. Despite facing financial constraints, Kenya remains committed to sustaining its substantial investment in university education.

Through the new University Funding model, over Kes. 9.2 billion has already been disbursed in loans and scholarships. I am pleased to note that the Laikipia University Council is prioritizing digital transformation in the institution. Our goal is for all universities to integrate technology in service delivery, ensuring that students are equipped to compete globally. I am delighted to note that the University enjoys high-speed internet connectivity that enables students to access learning materials on the e-learning platform. I congratulate your students for their exemplary performance in local and international competitions such as Huawei ICT competition held in China.

The Government also continues to explore opportunities for finding jobs for skilled workers abroad. This is championed by His Excellency the President, Dr. William Samoei Ruto, who has established the State Department for Diaspora to facilitate and support the aspirations of our talented and ambitious youth beyond our borders. In line with the goal of making Kenyan universities global competitors, I urge universities to emphasize the importance of internationalisation. Kenya's universities have the potential to attract students from across Africa and beyond, positioning the country as a hub for higher learning.

This is an opportunity for our universities to engage in global knowledge exchange, fostering research and innovation that will benefit both Kenya and the international community.

To our dear graduands, we acknowledge that you have been successfully trained and have consequently attained new skills. You now need to exploit the competencies acquired to benefit yourself and the communities around you to impact all positively. **Business Process Re-engineering and Digitalization:** In our ongoing efforts to improve efficiency, the university is re-engineering and digitalizing selected university processes. **Digitalization and Automation Strategy:** We are in the process of formulating a University Digitalization and Automation Strategy to integrate technology into our day-to-day operations and academic offerings. The University has experienced a steady growth in student numbers. The Kenya Universities and Colleges Central Placement Service (KUCCPS) has increased the number of students placed to Laikipia University from 2528 in 2023-2024 to over 3000 in the 2024-2025 Academic Year. Within these numbers, the placement of TVET students is an excellent indicator that Laikipia University is working towards the achievement of national goals and the university's mission. Indeed, Laikipia University is the *University of Choice*.

As far as **our Core Mandate** is concerned, the University has achieved several milestones; enhancement of Students Completion Rate, Community Outreach Programmes, and Student Mentorship Programmes.

With specific reference to the enhancement of students' completion rates, Laikipia University remains steadfast in its commitment to supporting its students in achieving their academic aspirations within the recommended timeframes. This journey demands strong teamwork, marked by mutual dedication and collaboration between the University and students. George Ouma Ogal of Student Registration number MDL31/2645/21 is an excellent example of this commitment. He completed his PhD programme within the prescribed three-year period and will be conferred a PhD in Applied Linguistics today. He was admitted to the PhD programme in September 2021, defended his thesis on 16<sup>th</sup> September 2024, and made a final submission of the thesis on 5<sup>th</sup> November 2024. His dedication, perseverance, and academic excellence are commendable, and we celebrate his outstanding achievement. Such success stories reaffirm our belief that every student can excel and complete their studies in record time with determination and the right support. Indeed, as Dr. Eliud Kipchoge, our cherished Alumni, says, '**No Human is Limited**'. We salute George Ogal, who by the end of this ceremony will be **Dr. George Ouma Ogal. Bravo!**

I note with appreciation that the Division of Academic, Research and Student Affairs held a Research and Innovation Day on 21<sup>st</sup> March 2024 whose theme was '*Leveraging Research and Innovation Dividends for sustainable development*' to showcase staff and students' innovations. This was part of Science, Innovation and Technology (STI) and Outreach activities. To enhance innovation and commercialization activities, the University has developed the Laikipia University Science, Technology, and Innovation (STI) Mainstreaming Strategy, which it is implementing.

Further, the Academic Division is engaged in research and disseminating findings through publications in the university's online journals. The Division has spearheaded workshops and capacity-building programmes for both staff and students to equip them with the necessary skills in the public policy-making process and the role of research in public policy, and to bridge the gap between Academia and industry. These included the CBE workshop, KIPPRA Annual Regional conference, ICPAK, and KUCCPS career advising.

The University has also undertaken several other activities as part of meeting its core mandate which include; trainings to enhance CBC readiness, compliance with government circulars, reviewing a number of our academic programmes, equipping the science laboratories, improvement of the library services, and enhancement of students' welfare.

Permit me to highlight some of the notable developments and achievements we have accomplished this year:



**Environmental Sustainability:** The University is taking bold steps towards environmental stewardship with an **ambitious plan to plant 30,000 trees** within and outside the campus this financial year. This is not just about beautifying our surroundings; it is a commitment to reducing our carbon footprint and promoting sustainability within our community and beyond. In the years 2023-2024, we managed to plant 15,800 trees, which is three times what we have been planting in previous years.

**Collaboration with County and Research Institutes:** We are in the process of establishing a collaboration with **Laikipia County Government** and **Kenya Forest Research Institute (KEFRI)**. This partnership will leverage our collective expertise in environmental research, agricultural development, and forestry, ensuring we are at the forefront of innovation in these critical areas.

**Enhancing Farm Production (Increasing Zero Grazing Capacity and Crop Production):** The University has made efforts towards being self-sustaining. In line with our vision for a sustainable agricultural future, we are in the process of completing the works on a 50 Cows Capacity Zero Grazing Unit, a key initiative to boost agricultural education and practice. This facility will provide an excellent resource for our students to gain hands-on experience in sustainable farming practices while contributing to our food security and economic development goals. We are also working on **increasing the number of cows under Zero Grazing** to enhance milk production and improve the livelihoods of those engaged in our agricultural programmes.

Laikipia University participated in the 2024 Nakuru ASK Show, which ran from the 3<sup>rd</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> of July 2024 in Nakuru County. The University was feted for producing champions in the **Corriedale** breed category for both ram and ewe and **commercial layers chicken**. In addition, Laikipia University produced the best boar (pig) breed. I was very proud to receive the Champions' Trophy from the Cabinet Secretary of Agriculture on behalf of the University.

**Self-Assessment of Academic Programmes:** The University is undergoing a comprehensive **self-assessment of its academic programmes**, ensuring that we continue to meet the evolving needs of the job market and our students. This process will help us maintain academic excellence and align our programmes with national and global standards.

**Productivity Improvement Strategy:** As part of our commitment to continuous improvement, we have developed a **Productivity Improvement Strategy** and are implementing it to boost the university's productivity index. This will ensure that we optimize our resources and enhance the impact of our research, teaching, and community engagement.

**Graduate Tracer Study:** In our ongoing commitment to understanding the success of our graduates, we are undertaking a **Graduate Tracer Study**. This study will provide valuable insights into the career trajectories of our alumni and guide us in improving our academic offerings to better prepare future graduates for the workforce.

#### **Collaborations:**

The University is undertaking a research project; 'Building Capacity in Plant Breeding and Biotechnology Education and Research through a partnership programme in Africa, the Middle East and Europe for Agricultural transformation (BREEDTECH). This project is in collaboration with Egerton University and has partnering institutions in the Middle East (Palestine), Europe (Sweden, Italy, Austria, Switzerland and Serbia) and Africa (Kenya and Ethiopia). The project is set to benefit the University in capacity



building for staff and students as well as curriculum development and research equipment.

It is exciting to report that the University has established a collaboration with Nyandarua National Polytechnic in Research, Science, Technology, and Innovation (RSTI). This partnership will enable us to jointly pursue cutting-edge research and foster innovation that will benefit our institutions and the broader community.

The University has renewed its partnerships with Wageningen University and Research in the Netherlands and the International Center for Tropical Agriculture (CIAT). These partnerships target, among other things, developing curriculum and scaling up relevant climate-smart agriculture (CSA) technologies, innovations, and practices.

We continue to work with Cisco and Huawei Academies. Our students participated in the China Huawei ICT competition and performed very well.

A research project with St. Martin Catholic Apostolate is ongoing as well as the outreach programme that is aired every week on LU Radio 89.2 FM.

Laikipia University is committed to **equity and inclusivity**. It is our belief that no student should be left behind due to economic or social factors. To this end, we have enhanced the bursary and work-study programmes to assist needy and vulnerable students. I want to thank the Jaffer Foundation Charitable Trust, Laikipia University Alumni, Laikipia University Students Union (LUSA), and Rattansi Foundation for offering the much-needed bursaries for our students. However, we still need more funds to be able to cater for more students than we currently are doing.

Institutional Quality Assurance has been enhanced through continued implementation of an Integrated Management System based on ISO 9001:2015 (QMS) and ISO/IEC 27001:2013 (ISMS) Standards. The University launched its Strategic Plan for the period 2023-2027 to chart the University's Strategic Direction for the next five years, and a productivity improvement strategy to enhance efficiency and effectiveness in university operations.

Amidst all these achievements, we have also faced some challenges. The biggest challenge remains funding. To be able to complete our capital projects and continue running the business of the university successfully, we need additional funding and it is my plea that the Ministry of Education continues supporting us.

As we look forward to the future, let us remember that learning is a lifelong journey. We look forward to having most of you back here for your postgraduate studies. There is still a lot to glean from the University; this is just the beginning. May you continue to seek knowledge, embrace challenges, and strive for excellence in all your endeavours. Remember, you are not just Graduates of Laikipia University, you are its ambassadors too. Carry our vision '**Nurture and Transform for the World**' beyond the gates of Laikipia University to wherever far and wide your destinies will lead you.

### ABOUT THE ACADEMIC DIVISION

**Research Projects:** Laikipia University entered into a collaborative research project 'Building Capacity in Plant Breeding and Biotechnology Education and Research through a partnership programme in Africa, the Middle East and Europe for Agricultural transformation (BREEDTECH) for which Laikipia University is a collaborating partner and secured funding of € 87,586.00. The project is led by Egerton University and has partnering institutions in the Middle East (Palestine), Europe (Sweden, Italy, Austria, Switzerland and Serbia) and Africa (Kenya and Ethiopia). The project which runs from March 2024 to March 2027 is set to benefit the University in capacity building for staff and students as well as curriculum development and research equipment.



The University through the Division of Academic, Research and Student Affairs, has renewed its partnership with Wageningen University and Research in the Netherlands. The University has also renewed its MoU with The International Center for Tropical Agriculture (CIAT). These partnerships target to among other things, develop curriculum and scale up relevant Climate Smart Agriculture (CSA) technologies, innovations, and practices.

The Division continues to take lead in its Research and Innovation mandate. To this end, it successfully held its 4<sup>th</sup> Research and Innovation Day on 21<sup>st</sup> March, 2024 whose theme was: *Leveraging Research and Innovation Dividends for Sustainable Development*. The keynote speaker, Dr. Tonny Omwansa, CEO of the Kenya National Innovation Agency (KENIA), delivered a remarkable speech on exploring the transformative potential of research and innovation.

**Intellectual Property:** The Division through the Directorate of Research, Human Rights and Gender, in May 2024, facilitated the filing of two innovations and two utility models with the Kenya Industrial Property Institute (KIPI) for patenting. The Division has also developed and ensured approval of the Intellectual Property Rights Policy that will safeguard the intellectual rights of innovators within the university.

**Internal Grants:** To promote the research culture, the University gave internal grants to eight (8) members of academic staff. Internal grants are crucial for fostering academic excellence, innovation, professional development, and institutional growth. This ultimately benefits both individual staff members and the broader university community.

**Outreach Activities:** Indeed, as per the mission of the university, outreach activities continue to take centre stage. As such, experts from the Psychology Department visited the Naivasha Maximum Prison to offer psychosocial support services to prisoners and members of staff there. University staff also visited 50 households in Rumuruti to offer extension services to farmers.

**Partnerships and Collaborations:** The Division has continued to strengthen collaborations, and linkages to enhance research activities as well as improve the students' industry experience. This year, the University signed a Collaborative Agreement with Nyandarua National Polytechnic and Teach2Give, a US-based organisation on a mission to transform education and employment prospects in Kenya. The University has initiated a partnership with the National Environment Trust Fund (NETFUND) on resource mobilization. Additionally, the division has ensured the renewal of a Collaborative Agreement with Karlstad University in Sweden to promote students' exchange programmes.

**Cultural Days:** The division has put in place measures to strengthen cohesion and improve Kenyans' diversity and creativity through the facilitation of students' cultural days to showcase talent and provide opportunities to appreciate diverse cultural orientations. Cultural Days play a significant role in enriching the student experience by promoting national unity and patriotism, diversity and inclusivity, fostering personal growth, enhancing academic learning, and building a strong, interconnected university community.

### Academics Activities

**Teacher Education Programme:** In keeping with the current education reforms and following the requirement by the Commission for University Education (CUE) that universities align their teacher education programmes (TEP) to Competency-Based

Education, the Division has reviewed the following programmes in the **School of Education**:

1. Bachelor of Education (Arts)
2. Bachelor of Education (Science)
3. Bachelor of Early Childhood Development Education (ECDE)
4. Bachelor of Science in Agricultural Education and Extension
5. Postgraduate Diploma in Education

The Commission for University Education visited Laikipia University in October, 2024 to undertake technical inspection for Laikipia University Teacher Education Programmes and gave a positive recommendation. This is important for us as a University since we strive for excellence which leads to better education outcomes for students thereby contributing to national development through improved workforce skills, economic growth, and social stability.

**Laikipia University Open, Distance and e-Learning (ODEL) Centre:** To expand access to education opportunities and flexible modes of study, Laikipia University has established an ODeL Centre. The Commission for University Education carried out site and technical inspection of the ODeL Centre in October 2024 and gave a positive rating. This is significant since ODeL supports diverse learners while helping the university adapt to global trends and contribute to personal and societal development.

The Division has spearheaded the development of new academic programmes and review of existing ones to align with market demands. The review of Diploma Programmes under TVET is complete. The degree programmes developed this year are:

**Mentorship for High School Students:** The University through the Deans of Schools and Director TVET conducted career mentorship and advising to twenty (20) secondary schools in the Counties of Laikipia, Nakuru and Nyandarua between the months of February and July, 2024.

Further, the Institute of Certified Public Accountants of Kenya (ICPAK), Central Rift Branch carried out mentorship and career talk to Laikipia University students in February, 2024. The Division, additionally, supported and facilitated eight (8) students including Laikipia University Student Association (LUSA) Chairperson to attend a capacity-building workshop for students at the 7<sup>th</sup> KIPPRA Annual Regional Conference held in Kisumu City between 23<sup>rd</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> June, 2024. The Division also facilitated three (3) students and two (2) staff members to showcase their innovative projects at the 4<sup>th</sup> CUE Biennial Conference held in June, 2024 in Nairobi City.

During the National Celebrations of 2024 Africa Public Service Day (APSD) held from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> June, 2024 at Kenya School of Government in Nairobi City, Laikipia University's student project '*Smart Agriculture System*' was awarded the 2<sup>nd</sup> Runners Up in the Agricultural Transformation Category. The adoption of smart agriculture by universities is essential for advancing agricultural research and innovation.





Consequently, Laikipia University is empowering the community by addressing critical global issues like food security, climate change, and sustainability.

As part of our commitment to enhancing our readiness for Competency-Based Education (CBE), the University through the School of Education has continued to provide targeted retooling training for members of academic staff on Competency-Based Education. As such, the division undertook CBE trainings in January and August, 2024.

As intervention efforts to improve the quality of education for our students, the division spearheaded automation of the university library by procuring Library Security System and acquired e-books in all university academic programmes. The University has renewed the Turnitin antiplagiarism software and developed antiplagiarism guidelines to enhance quality in research publications.

**Student Welfare:** The Division enhanced student financial support assistance programme through; award of Laikipia University Bursaries at a cost of Kes. 1,000,000 and placed needy students on the Work Study Programme at a cost of Kes. 1,642,800. These bursaries are an essential means for making higher education more accessible and equitable. By alleviating the financial burden of students, they are able to focus on their academic goals, reduce stress, and increase their chances of success, both during their studies and in their future careers.

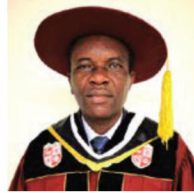

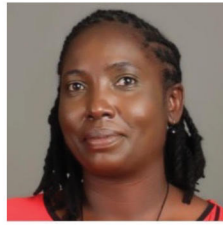
