Remarkable Growth and Achievements in 2025

The year 2025 has been one of consolidation and noteworthy milestones:

1. Academic Excellence & Expansion

- i. Six (6) new market-driven academic programmes have been developed, i.e. BSc in Economics, BSc in Economics and Finance, BSc in Climate Smart Agriculture, MSc in Economics, MSc in Agricultural Economics and PhD in Economics.
- ii. Student enrolment has risen impressively to 10,368 from 8,909 in 2024, reflecting growing confidence in Laikipia University as the institution of choice

2. Research, Innovation & Global Visibility

- i. Increased research output with more research papers being published in our online journals.
- ii. Successfully hosted the 6th Biennial International Conference, disseminating cutting-edge research findings.
- iii. Strengthened partnerships in Research, Science, Technology, and Innovation (RSTI) with Kenya Forestry Research Institute (KEFRI), World Agroforestry (CIFOR-ICRAF), GROOTS-Kenya, National Environmental Trust Fund (NETFUND) among others.

3. Environmental Stewardship & National Goals

- i. Planted and nurtured 26,840 trees in 2025, contributing significantly to the National Tree Growing and Restoration Campaign
- ii. Hosted World Environmental Day celebrations under the theme “Tree Planting for Sustainable Environmental Conservation and Equity”, training farmers and students in agroforestry and climate-smart agriculture

4. Community Engagement & Social Impact

- i. Conducted community outreach and mentorship programmes
- ii. Conducted a historic Peace Mission in Churo, Tiaty East (Baringo County) promoting inter-community harmony through mentorship, leadership engagement, and tree-planting initiatives


