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CHIEF GUEST BIOGRAPHY OF HON. JUSTICE ISAAC LENAOLA, LLB, MBA, MSC, MBS, CBS -JUDGE OF THE SUPREME COURT

Ton. Justice Isaac Lenaola was born on 21st December, 1967 in Samburu County, Kenya. He is a Justice of Kenya of the Supreme Court of Kenya.

Justice Isaac Lenaola began his education in 1973 at St. Mary's Nursery School in Maralal. In 1974, he attended Maralal D.E.B. Primary School, then moved to Baragoi Primary School where he sat for his C.P.E examinations. He joined Alliance High School for his O-Levels studies and A-levels from the year 1981 to 1986. He was awarded the Gandhi Smarak Nidhi Award for the best possible achievement in A-Levels in Kenya. In 1987, Justice Isaac Lenaola joined the University of Nairobi for his LLB (Bachelor of Laws) studies and graduated with a Second Class Honours Upper Division in 1990.

After admission to the bar, he practised law in Nairobi, specializing in Commercial Law and Land Law. He served as a Commissioner both at the Peoples Commission of Kenya (PCK) and at the Constitution of Kenya Review Commission (CKRC). He also served as a member of the Tribunal Investigating the conduct of Puisne Judges.

He joined the judicial service in 2003 and worked as Resident Judge in Embu, Meru, Machakos and Kakamega High Courts. As a High Court Judge, Hon. Lenaola also served as a Commissioner at the Judicial Service Commission (JSC) where served as Chairman, Human Resource and Administration Committee (HRAC). He was previously a Member of the Board, Judicial Training Institute (JTI) and Chairman and member of various Judiciary Committees as well as Chairman of the Kenya Magistrates and Judges Association (KMJA) Treasurer of the East African Magistrates and Judges Association (EAMJA).

Until his appointment as Judge of the Supreme Court, Justice Lenaola was the Presiding Judge of the Constitutional and Human Rights Division at the High Court in Milimani, Nairobi where he rendered illuminating and ground breaking decisions on human rights, devolution, separation of powers among other areas of jurisprudence. In all the stations he served outside Nairobi, he is reputed for diligence, hard work and has on many occasions been cited as an example in the best of case management and backlog clearance.

Justice Lenaola has served as Judge and Deputy Principal Judge of the Court of First Instance of the East African Court of Justice (EACJ) from 2011 to 2018 and as a Judge at the Residual Special Court for Sierra Leone (RSCL) from 2013 to-date. He is President of the Advisory Council of the



Strathmore Institute for Advanced Studies in International Criminal Justice (SIASIC) and President of the International Association of Refugee and Migration Judges (IARMJ). He is a Fellow of McLaughlin College, York University, Toronto, Canada and Fellow, Chartered Institute of Arbitrators (FCIArb). He is also Chairman of the Judicial Action Group (JAG) and a member of the Commonwealth Magistrates and Judges Association (CMJA), the Accountability Panel of the Wildlife Justice Commission (WJC) and also the African Judges and Jurists Forum (AJJF).

Honourable Justice Lenaola was awarded the Law Society of Kenya award for distinguished service in the Administration of Justice (2008), the East African Law Society honorary membership award for exemplary service, and the development of jurisprudence in Kenya and the East African Region (2015) as well as distinguished service awards in the service of the International Association of Refugee and Migration Judges (IARMJ) (2014 & 2018). He is also a recipient of the Moran of the Burning Spear (MBS) from the President of the Republic of Kenya for distinguished service in the administration of justice in Kenya and the East African Region. He has also been named Jurist of the Year by the International Commission of Jurists (ICJ) Kenya Chapter (2019).

BIOGRAPHY OF ALHAJ DR. MOHAMED HUSEIN ABDULLA JAFFER, CBS, EBS, MBS

Alhaj Dr. Mohamed Husein Abdulla Jaffer was born on 10th March 1948 in Mombasa, Kenya. He is married and has three adult children (2 sons and a daughter), 6 Grandsons and 1 Granddaughter. He talks very fondly of his family and is very proud of them.

Dr. Jaffer is the great-great grandson of Dewji Jamal, one of the pioneers who came to East Africa in the year 1860 and traded as Shariff, Jaffer and Company. His family ventured in various trades as ship owners, bankers and merchants. They were the first Bankers to His Majesty King George V. They were also Founder members of the Chamber of Commerce, and Founders of the first Power and Lighting Company in Lamu. One of his great uncles, whom he is named after, is the Hajj Mohamed Jaffer Dewji, a famous religious leader and a scholar. Dr. Jaffer's own father was a councillor of the Mombasa Municipal Council in the pre-independence period, and fought for the country's independence.

Dr. Jaffer is a philanthropist par excellence who has a huge social impact and is involved in very many social and community activities, in a bid to uplift humanity. An



astute business person, who has succeeded in start-ups in the emerging markets, he is quoted as saying that one's business cannot be safe in a castle if those around you live in shanties. For this, he is very passionate about improving the lives of all those around him in the society and this is actually what he does at his best. He is also quoted as saying that 'If only wealthy people in this country would give 20 percent only of their wealth, this country would be very different'. Dr Jaffer walks the talk! This is his strong conviction.

Dr. Jaffer is the Chairman and Trustee of the Jaffer Foundation Charitable Trust whose main philanthropy activities cater for water, food, health, social welfare and religious support, and education projects to help change the lives of communities in the Coast region. He is also a founder, trustee and member of various clubs and organizations in Kenya. These include being a Founder Member of the Rotary Club of Bahari Mombasa; the Founder of Jaipur Foot Endowment Fund: the Founder of the Polio Plus Endowment Fund: the Founder of Innerwheel Breast Cancer Endowment Fund: and the Founder of the Charitable Trust of Bahari Club among others.

Being focused on having a holistic and all-inclusive kind of life as well as serving humanity, Dr Jaffer is a Life Member of the Muslim Education Welfare Association (MEWA); Life Member of the Kenya Red Cross Society; Life Member of the United Sports Club; the Patron of Jaffery Sports Complex; Member of the Nyali Golf Club; Member of Mombasa Sports Club; and is also the current Chairman and Managing Trustee of Khoja Shia Ithna-Asheri Jamaat in Mombasa.

Due to his exceptional social and

philanthropic work, Dr. Jaffer has been recognized and honoured both nationally and internationally. In May 2020, he was honoured with the Appreciation Award of Corona Warriors Award in Humanitarian Services by the President of Friendship with The World (NGO), Mr. Shasi Kumar. On 15th January 2019, Dr. Jaffer was conferred with the prestigious Honorary Doctorate of Philosophy in Humanities (PhD) by the United Graduate College and Seminary International. He was also bestowed with the World Civility Leadership Award by H. E. Prof. Sir Clyde Rivers of iChange Nations (ICN).

Recently, on 8th July 2022 Dr. Jaffer was honoured with the title of 'Chief of the Order of the Burning Spear' (CBS) by the President of Kenya - H. E. Uhuru Kenyatta. On 12th December, 2012 during the Jamhuri Day celebrations, Dr. Jaffer was conferred with the title of 'Elder of the Burning Spear' (EBS) by the former President of Kenya - H. E. Mwai Kibaki. Earlier, on 1st June during 2000 during the Madaraka Day celebrations, the then president of Kenya - H. E. Daniel T. Arap Moi honoured him with the title 'Moran of the Order of the Burning Spear' (MBS).

Being an adept businessman, Dr. Jaffer is currently the Chairman of the MJ Group of Companies, which is Kenya's largest provider of cargo handling services. The MJ Group has specialized in establishing and installing cargo handling terminals (for instance, Grain, Edible Oil, Fertiliser, Clinker, Bitumen, Petroleum, LPG Gas, APM CFS) with the latest state-of-art equipment. The Group's particular success has been in port development projects in East Africa and abroad specializing in handling both Dry and Liquid Bulk Cargo. Additionally,



they have established a Grain Terminal at Port of Lake Charles, Louisiana, USA. The Group's reputation has attracted interest from outside countries and exporting its expertise overseas.

Dr. Jaffer is not only a very successful businessman but also a very special human being who cares for humanity and does a lot of philanthropic work because of his conviction to improve and transform the lives of people around him and society in general. He is an inspiration for all who would like to have start-ups in the emerging markets. This in itself is an inspiration to all who have a chance to interact with him. It is humbling to observe that Dr. Jaffer has given assistance to many Kenyans to a better life by helping pay school fees, build schools, churches and other start-up businesses.





This is an important day as it is the wholesome hard work and endurance that has culminated in this historic occasion. I am excited to witness the conferment of degrees and award of diplomas to the graduands in their various areas of specialization. This event esteems the

Laikipia University fraternity. Well done on this accomplishment!

With the valued support of the Ministry of Education and the synergy exhibited in the University Council, the University Management Board, Senate, staff and students, we have continued to witness strides of growth and development in the University. The existence of a serene academic environment that spurs quality learning and fosters research, scholarship and innovation has worked towards producing transformative graduands. These





graduands have gained the necessary knowledge and skills to contribute to the realization of the national development goals and agenda.

Our graduates have cut out a niche for themselves in the job market and industry due to the unique knowledge acquired in the course of their studies. This has resulted in a steady growth of student numbers as witnessed in the placement numbers allocated by the Kenya Universities and Colleges Central Placement (KUCCPS) which have increased from 1884 to 2528 this academic year. Within these numbers, the placement of TVET students is a great indicator that Laikipia University is working towards the achievement of its mission. Indeed, Laikipia University is the University of Choice.

Laikipia University has in the recent past continued to enhance internationalization of its programmes through strategic collaborations and linkages. This is critical in the empowerment of our students, since it provides them with cutting-edge skills and the mindset to enable them to cope with life and professional challenges. Recently, University in collaboration with the University of Pretoria

in South Africa, Egerton University in Kenya, and the Future Africa Campus of University of Pretoria hosted a multidisciplinary conference research sustainable agricultural development. customer-focused Business Process Reengineering concept aimed to achieve a turnaround in service delivery, particularly on academic processes. This is enhanced by the continued implementation of the integrated ISO Standards on Information Security Management System (ISMS) and Quality Management System (QMS). The University is also implementing several projects and programmes under the Rapid Results Initiative as it strives to maximise its limited resources. The initiatives have seen the University commence the construction of the perimeter fence, the zero-grazing unit, and equipping the gymnastic and other sporting equipment among others. These programmes are expected to enhance customer satisfaction.

Student welfare is a critical component of the university. Given this, the University has consistently on an annual basis secured a budget, places students on a work-study programme and awarded bursaries to needy students. I am aware this programme has gone a long way in ensuring the sustainability of needy students in the University leading to improved completion rates. To this end, the University is exploring means of launching scholarship programmes. Further, University Council approved a policy on the establishment of an Endowment Fund. The University is committed to establishing a Board that shall explore means and ways of generating and tapping valuable resources that may go into scholarships and bursaries for the needy. I therefore, call upon Alumni and philanthropists to come in and support these noble ideas.

The University, like other public institutions, is constrained as far as resources are concerned. The resource mobilization strategies are therefore critical. The University shall continue to prudently utilize available resources. Consequently, the Council approved a Resource Mobilization

policy to guide this. In the near future, the University is investing in establishing a consultancy bureau aimed at fully exploiting opportunities in the economy. The acquisition of professional skills is vital to graduates for the competitive job market. The University has therefore developed short courses that are to be rolled out in this financial year for purposes of equipping specialized skills to the students. The short courses should also enhance resource mobilization. Additionally, the University is revamping its farm as a strategic resource mobilization unit.

Laikipia University Journals

The Laikipia University Journal of Social Sciences, Education and Humanities (JSSEH) and Journal of Science and Applied Technology (JSAT) are peer reviewed scholarly journals published by the Directorate of Research, Human Rights and Gender. The journals provide platforms for original and multidisciplinary research. Previously, the journals were published in print form but in the recent past, the Directorate has been working to turn them into online journals which will make them more regular. The inaugural volumes of the journals were published on 23rd May 2022 and are accessible online on the Journal portal at www. laikipia.ac.ke.







The online journals use *Open Journal Systems* (OJS) 3.3.0.10, which is an open source journal management and publishing software developed, supported, and freely distributed by the Public Knowledge Project under the General Public License. The University has established an Online Journals Publishing Committee to oversee the development of the platform and journal publication management. Some of its members participated in awareness creation workshops hosted at Kenyatta University (February 2022) and Moi University (12th May, 2022) on open access online journals publishing. The Directorate continues to work to ensure that the journals meet the required standards for accreditation.

Under capacity building and information dissemination, the Directorate carries out various trainings like hosting the International Women's Day and training on science, technology and innovation (ST&I) mainstreaming.

Through LU-ISERC, the University has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Garissa University for affiliation. The University is committed to being in the forefront in ensuring that the country realizes its dream of having research of high ethical standards and seeing to it that all research is conducted in a manner that respects the dignity, rights, and welfare of all participants.

LU-ISERC operates under the umbrella of the National Commission for Science, Technology and Innovation (NACOSTI). It is charged with ensuring compliance with all regulations, policies, and standards that concern animal and human welfare. It also engages in monitoring the implementation of approved research, as well as preparing and submitting annual reports to NACOSTI. The Committee at all times safeguards the dignity, rights, safety, and wellbeing of all study participants and communities while paying special attention to investigations that may involve vulnerable groups. In this regard, the Committee reviews all submitted applications in accordance with the procedures established by LU-ISERC. It reviews every research proposal before actual research is initiated. The Committee evaluates, with proper justification, all possible risks to participants and subjects, as well as the expected benefits and adequacy of documentation for ensuring privacy, confidentiality and justice issues. It is expected that in the future, the Committee shall develop mechanisms of networking with other Institutional Scientific Ethics Review Committees (ISERCs) within the region and internationally.

We are glad to inform the general public that the LU-ISERC is now fully operational and proposals from our students and staff are being reviewed. The committee sits on the first Wednesday of every month. Applicants are requested to hand in their documents before the 15th day of every month in order to give the secretariat enough time for processing.

TBELE DAIMA! My eight-year journey in the University **L**started with a lot of hurdles. The first fundraising made me secure my admission as a self-sponsored student at Embu college which was then a campus of Laikipia University This beginning

was uniquely characterized by hardship like 'msoto', hunger just to mention a few. The hardship did not deter my determination. Armed with my motto, 'Mbele Daima', I had to press on to see a successful completion of the first year.

On the reporting day of the second year, I did not leave home because the promise I had been given by a financial well-wisher never materialized. I reluctantly reported in the third week of the semester with very little money for upkeep. The matron had to take all my beddings because I had not paid money for the accommodation. I slept on an empty bed without a mattress for one week as I sought the next survival technique. For food, I survived on 'kangumu' and hot water from the shower. I resorted to looking for any work around and was blessed with an opportunity to peel potatoes in a nearby 'kibanda' for a daily wage of 200 Kenya Shillings. With these earnings together with the loan from HELB, I successfully completed my second year.

At the start of the third year, all Education students were transferred to Laikipia University Main Campus where life became extremely hard once again. I had to halt my studies so that I could look for money. It took me four years before I could resume my studies.

Still determined as before, I came back to campus in 2020, and resided at 'kwa Ndoro's' hostel surviving on the little I had saved. Just as I was getting settled in, the Covid-19 pandemic hit. I tell you my hope diminished as I thought of losing the tuition and the rental fee I had managed to pay. When we resumed from the longest holiday in history, I was faced with an emerging problem of missing marks as a result of my long hiatus from campus and being placed with different cohorts because my cohort had long graduated. To cut the story short, after numerous follow ups, the problem was eventually sorted out. In the fourth year, wellwishers, RATTANSI bursary and CDF bursaries made me clear all the tuition fee. Thanks to the well-wishers, CDF, and Laikipia University for the support. I am happily graduating today with a second class honours (Upper Division) and fully longing and determined to begin my Master's degree as soon as possible. There is hope.

To the continuing students and fellow graduands, I have decided to give my own story so as to reignite your determinations and hope. If I decided to keep the story to myself, some of us would not make even a single step. The hurdles we meet in life are simply meant to strengthen us. Your family background should not determine your destiny. Take time, think critically, stop crying since tears will not let you see the light at the end of the tunnel. Press On! 'Mbele Daima'!
