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n May 2015, Laikipia University was certified under the Quality Management System based on ISO 9001:2008. However, in September 2018, ISO 9001:2008 became obsolete and was replaced by ISO 9001:2015. This automatically meant that Laikipia University's certification under ISO 9001:2008 also became obsolete.

In the year Financial Year 2017-2018, The Government of Kenya through the Performance Management and Coordination Office, Executive Office of the President directed all Ministries, Departments and Agencies to implement Information Security Management System. This directive meant that implementation of ISO 27001:2013 was to be targeted under the Safety and Security Indicator of 2017-2018 Performance Contract.

Based on the obsolescence of ISO 9001:2008 and the Government directive to target implementation of Information Security Management System under the Safety and Security Indicator of Performance Contract in 2017-2018, Laikipia University engaged Maier Consulting Limited on 20th December, 2017 to guide the University in process of transition to ISO 9001:2015 and certification under ISO 27001:2013.

On Friday, the 22nd day of March 2019, Laikipia University Council, through its Representative Mr. Moses Marwa, launched the implementation of the two systems. The launch marked an important milestone since it meant that the University's operations were to be fully guided by the freshly documented processes and procedures. In addition, it aimed at providing assurance of consistency and effectiveness in services delivery to our esteemed customers – our Students.

The process of documentation of the two systems was achieved through several documenting sessions with the respective Heads of Departments taking the lead. After documentation, validation process of these documents was done in which these documentation were confirmed as a true reflection of Laikipia University operations. With the University's core mandate being training, research, innovation and community outreach, implementing these systems will assure and enhance customer satisfaction.

Laikipia University will tap into the benefits of the implementation of ISO 9001:2015 and ISO 27001:2013 in many ways that may include:

- Assured and enhanced customer satisfaction,
- Operating in efficient and effective manner,
- Improved financial management prudence,
- Continual improvement,
- Improved processes and operational strategies,
- Securing confidential information
- Management of information risks,
- Guaranteed business continuity,

Laikipia University intends to be ISO certified under ISO 9001:2015 and ISO 27001:2013 International Standards before the end of 2018-2019 Financial Year.

rofessor Kibett Rotich-Vice Chancellor, Laikipia University has appointed *Prof. Albert Mugambi***Rutere** to understudy Prof. James Ogola, Director Nakuru Campus.

Prof.Rutere is an Associate Professor in Literature in the department of Literary and Communication Studies, School of Humanities and Development Studies, Laikipia University.

Prof. Albert Rutere academic journey began back in 1968 when he enrolled in Standard 1 to Standard 7 at Kigane Primary School in Meru after which he joined Meru High School for A Level education. He got admission at Kenyatta University in1983 to pursue a Bachelor of Education Degree- specializing in English, English Literature and Education. In 1989 he got an ODA/British Council Scholarship through Kenyatta University to proceed to the University of Edinburgh Scotland, UK for a Master of Science in Applied Linguistics. In 1990, he returned to Kenya to teach Communication. In September 2002, he proceeded for his Doctoral Studies at Morgan State University in Baltimore, Maryland, USA. At MSU, he worked at the Writing Center, where among other duties he was tutoring undergraduate students in Academic Writing Skills. He won an Award for the best graduate student in College of Liberal Arts in 2009 due to his academic excellence. In the same year, he became the second PhD graduate student in Literature in English Department.

In the year 2011, he returned to Kenya and briefly worked as a Senior Lecturer at Catholic University of Eastern Africa (CUEA) where he became the Chair of English Department. He then joined Karatina University as a Senior Lecturer in the department of Humanities and Languages. In 2014 he joined Laikipia University as a Senior Lecturer in the department of Literary and Communication Studies.

He has worked as a Director Board of Undergraduate Studies, Teaching Practice, and Field Attachment besides teaching, supervising and mentoring duties..

He has published over 40 papers in refereed journals, edited several papers and 1 book, and authored 2 books. He chairs the Board of Management for Nkuene Boys Secondary School, Meru County.

His hobbies are; watching folk dances, plays and listening to political debates.


