## INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY CELEBRATIONS

In March this year, the centre celebrated the International Women's Day by holding public lectures around the year's theme 'Balance for Better' and on gender related concerns in the university. On this day the DVC (A&R), Prof. Wanjiku Chiuri and the DVC (AF&D), Prof. Isaac Ochieng' graced the occasion and made presentations on the subtle areas of gender discrimination and the history of International Women's Day respectively. Prof. Isaac Ochieng' emphasized on the need to involve men in championing of women's rights since women's rights are basically human rights that apply to all irrespective of their sexual orientation. He noted that if women were to get the equality and equity that they fervently fight for, then they must begin by incorporating men in their fight.

On women empowerment and sisterhood, Prof. Wanjiku Chiuri the DVC (A&R), talked about women being aware of the subtle areas in which they are silenced and end up losing their voices. She encouraged women to stand their ground and shun this kind of discrimination.

Dr. Sheila Wandera, the Coordinator Gender Centre, demystified Gender by giving a talk on the gender issues/concerns in Laikipia University. It was noted that those concerns related to both male and female. She urged members to break the silence and speak up for possible interventions.

HYMA an acronym for *Help Young Mothers Achieve*. The HYMA Day Care was launched on 8th March 2019. This project has received tremendous backing from the University Management and more so from the DVC (A&R) Prof.

The day care centre is meant to help student mothers in the following ways:

Wanjiku Chiuri who has the project at heart.

- Ensure that student mothers concentrate in their studies since they can check on their children when they want to;
- Ensure 100% class attendance of the student mothers;
- Help student mothers balance study and motherhood;
- Help children develop social skills as they mingle and play with other kids;
- Reduce anxiety for the student mothers since they
  are assured their children are in safe hands;

A young 3rd year student mother Lillian Kariuki, spoke

on behalf of the young mothers and thanked the University Management through the Gender Centre, for thinking about the welfare of the student mothers on Campus through the Day Care Initiative. She highlighted some of the areas where they face stigmatization as young student mothers. She voiced out that the young student mothers are just students who have decided to take responsibility for their actions, and that LU Community should give them a chance to redeem themselves.


#### COFFEE HOUR

aikipia University is committed to be at the forefront in ensuring that the country realizes its dream of having researches of high ethical standards; ensures research is conducted in a manner that respects the dignity, rights and welfare of participants. In this regard the University has established Laikipia University Institutional Ethics Review Committee (LU-IERC).

The LU-IREC is one of the key committees in research anchored in the Laikipia University Statutes and Research Policy.

LU-IERC shall operate under National Commission of Science, Technology and Innovation (NACOSTI). The Committee shall review all submitted applications in accordance with the procedure established by LU-IREC. The committee shall review every research proposal undertaken by members of Laikipia University (inclusive of undergraduates, postgraduates and staff) and community in the surrounding for ethical practices before the research is initiated. The Committee shall evaluate the possible risks to the participants and subjects with proper justification, the expected benefits and adequacy of documentation for ensuring privacy, confidentiality and the justice issues. In future, the Committee shall develop mechanisms of networking with other Institutional Ethics Review Committees (IERCs) within the region and internationally.

LU-IREC shall serve as the regulatory entity for research at Laikipia University and as an independent representative and competent body to review, evaluate and decide on the scientific and ethical merits of research proposals. It is committed to ensuring and guaranteeing the rights, dignity, safety and protection of actual or potential individuals and communities who participate in research. This respect for human participants should extend to non-human subjects, plants and the environment.

#### Role of the LU-IREC

- a. Coordinate and regulate all matters pertaining to research ethics and integrity at Laikipia University and its affiliate campuses;
- b. Receive, review all research proposals at LU on ethical issues and make recommendations to the NACOSTI;
- c. Ensure the protection of the dignity, rights and well-being of potential and actual research participants;
- d. Ensure compliance with all regulations, policies and standards to ensure animal welfare;
- e. Monitor the implementation of approved research to ensure ethical compliance; and
- f. Prepare and submit annual reports to the NACOSTI.



aikipia University is hosting Prof. Sinfree Bullock Makoni, a Professor of Applied Linguistics and African Studies at Pennsylvania State University –USA under the Carnegie African Diaspora Fellowship program.
